Safe2Tell Presentations

Sign up now for a Safe2Tell presentation for the start of next school year—August and September fill up fast! Presentations are available in person or virtually and run about 25 minutes. They cover what can be reported to Safe2Tell, how it works, anonymity, and whether it's effective. We emphasize talking to a trusted adult first, breaking the code of silence, and "See something, say something." The session includes key data, sample reports, and a quick true/false review.
