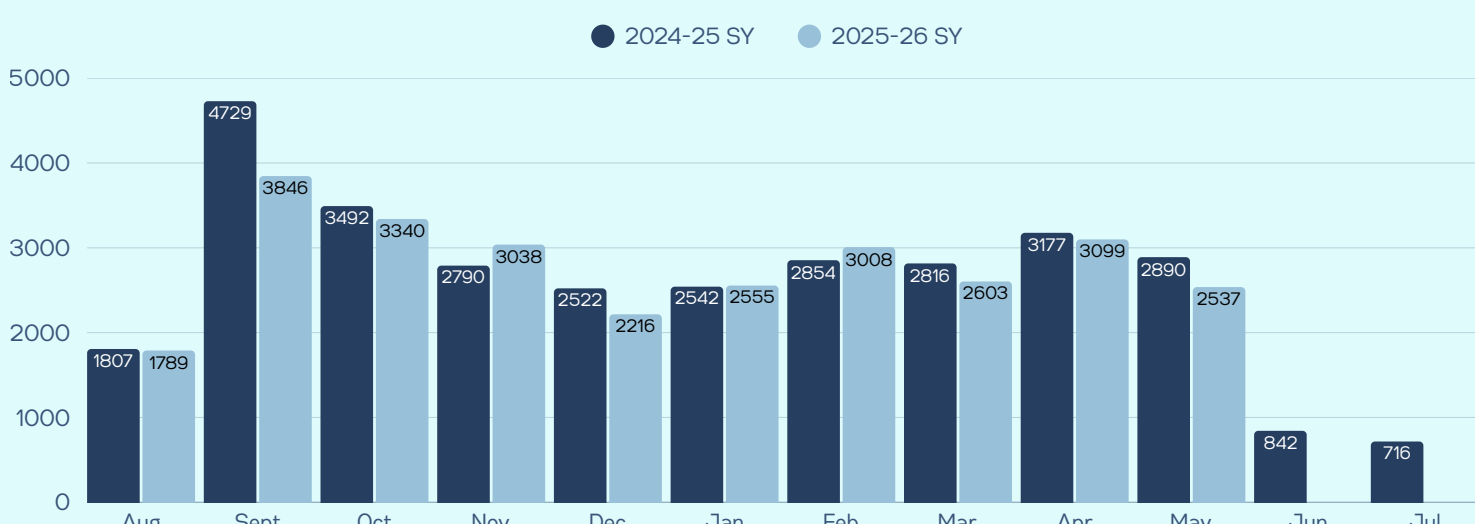

2,537 reports were received in May 2026, and 28,039 reports were received to date for the current school year.

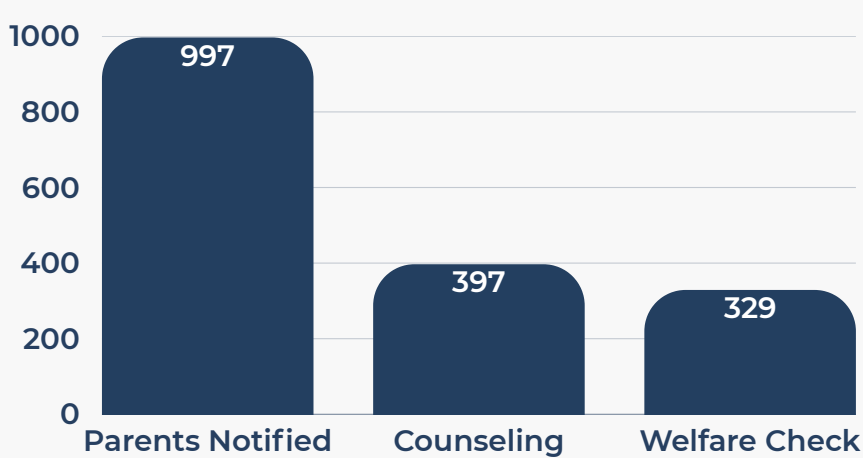

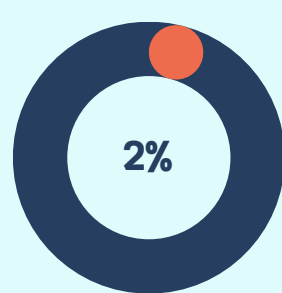

Report Example

A person reported that a student brought illegal substances to school and shared them with peers. School staff investigated and spoke with the student and their peers who confirmed the student was distributing substances. Parents were notified, the student was placed on a safety and reinstatement plan, and school disciplinary action was taken.

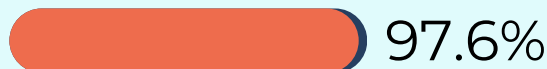


Duplicate Reports this SY



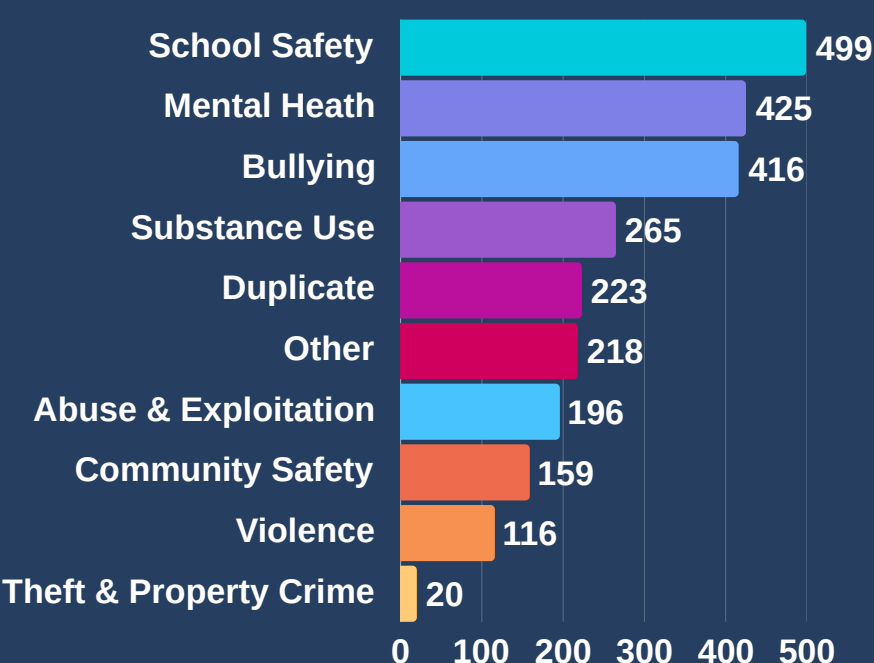
4,178 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year.

97.6% of reports received during the 25-26 school year, which began 8/1/25, were determined to be valid. Misuse reports were 0.6%, and false reports were 1.8%

May Reporting Themes



Report Example

A person reported that a student told peers not to attend school the next day, made gun-related gestures, and identified a person they intended to harm. Local law enforcement conducted a welfare check, spoke with the student and guardian, and completed a threat assessment. The student was referred to mental health resources. School disciplinary action was taken, including increased security and law enforcement presence the following day.
