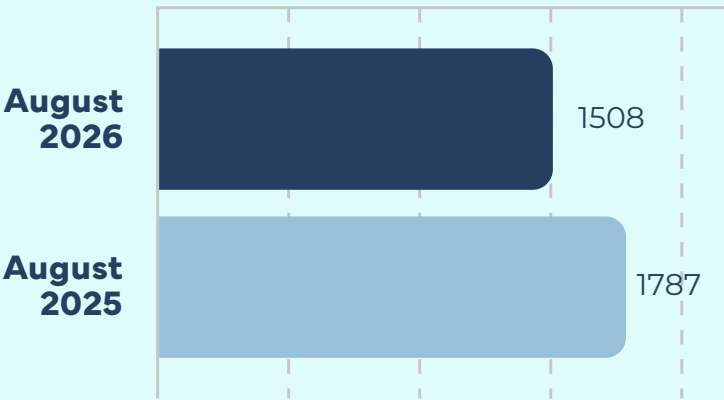




AUGUST 2026 MONTHLY REPORT

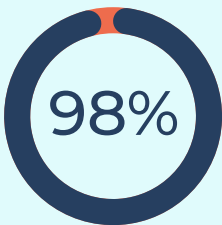
Reports by Month



1,508 reports were received in August 2026. School safety concern: staff (149), suicide (142), and bullying (94) were the top report types.

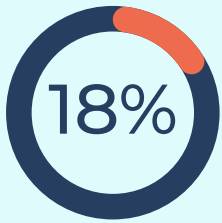
August Report Types

Valid Reports



98.1% of reports received during the 26-27 school year, which began 8/1/26, were determined to be valid. Misuse reports were 0.7%, and false reports were 1.2%

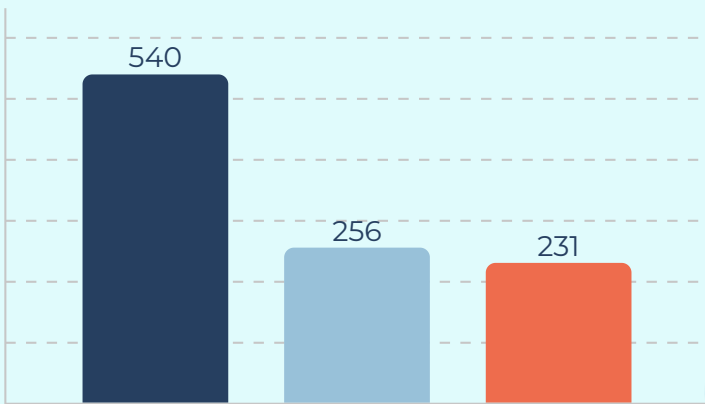

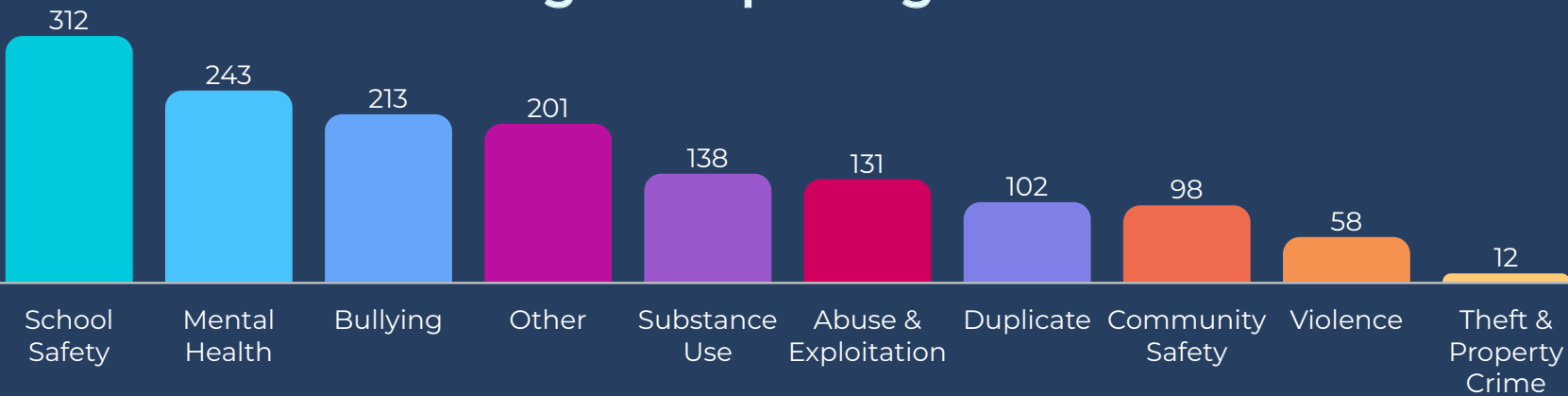

August Reporting Themes



Report Examples

- Safe2Tell received a report about a student who stated they wanted to harm and sexually assault another student and that they would harm themselves if the person making the report disclosed their comments. The School Resource Officer spoke with the student, who admitted making the statements but said they were a joke. The student received education on appropriate communication, their parent was contacted, school disciplinary action was taken, and a threat assessment was completed.
- A person reported that a student created an explicit AI-generated photo of a peer and shared it with classmates. School administration and the School Resource Officer spoke with the student, contacted their parent, and took school disciplinary action.

The information presented in this report is based on preliminary data provided by the Colorado Information Analysis Center, which processes Safe2Tell reports, and is subject to change. A routine audit is scheduled as part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining high standards of data integrity and transparency.
