




Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 904 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 131 duplicates were reported in December alone—an 21.6% decrease compared to November.

97.6% Valid reports



97.6% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Sample reports

- Correct use of Safe2Tell**

A person reported that a student was parked in a car and was pointing what looked like a firearm at other students. The school investigated and found the student with a toy gun. School disciplinary action was taken, a threat assessment was completed, the student is receiving counseling, and their parents were notified.
- Correct use of Safe2Tell**

A person reported that a student was selling drugs to other students at school. The school investigated and found drugs in the student's backpack. School Disciplinary Action was taken, the student's parents were notified, and the student was arrested.
- Misuse of Safe2Tell**

A person reported that their teacher was intentionally giving them a lower grade. Their concerns were forwarded to the appropriate personnel and this person was encouraged to contact their school or district in the future.
