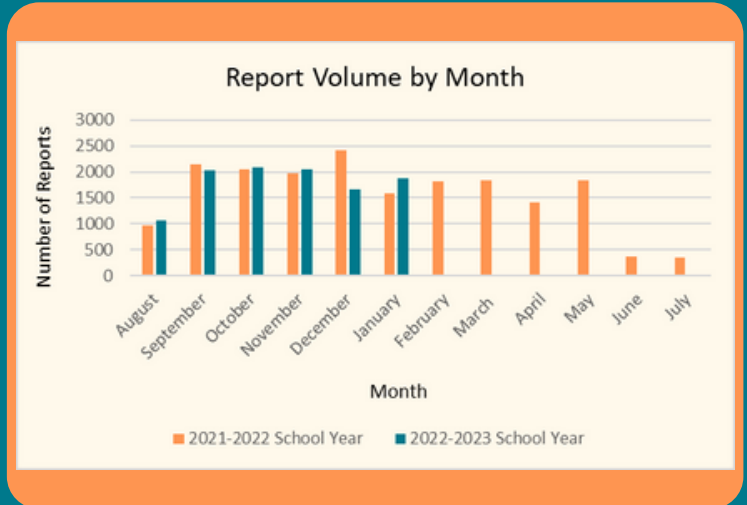

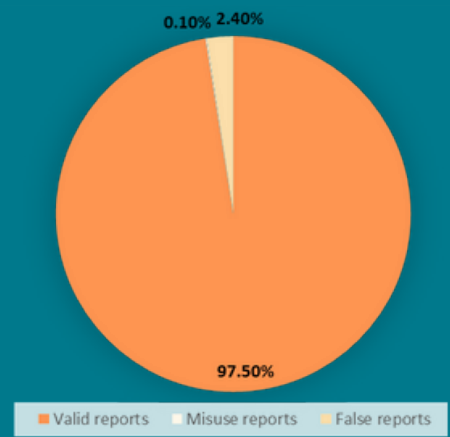
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 1,051 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 145 duplicates were reported in January alone—a 9% increase compared to December.

97.5% Valid reports



97.5% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

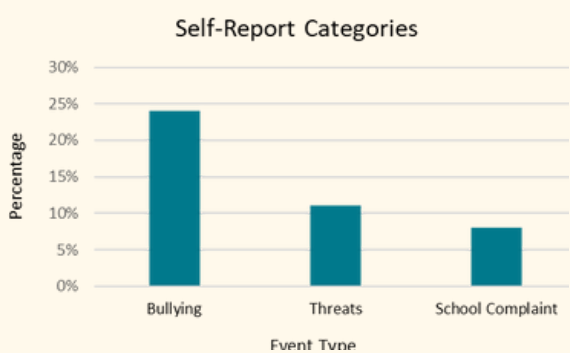
A person reported that a student threatened to shoot up their school. Local teams investigated and spoke with witnesses, which led to a threat assessment. The student is receiving counseling, their parents were notified, and school disciplinary action was taken.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that they were having suicidal thoughts and were in immediate danger. Local law enforcement investigated and transported them to the hospital.
