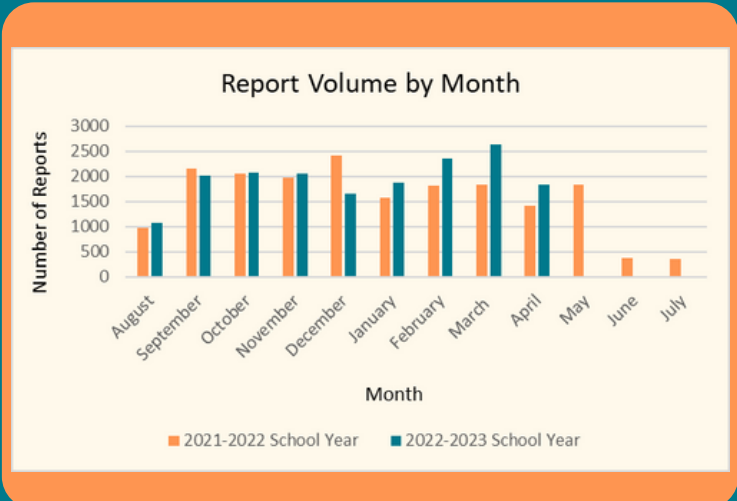

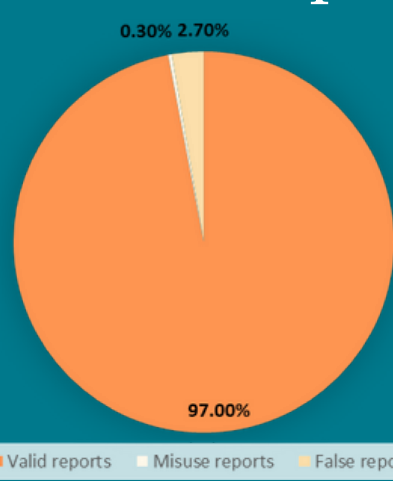
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 1,834 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 362 duplicates were reported in April alone—a 68% increase compared to March.

97% Valid reports



97% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Sample reports

- Correct use of Safe2Tell** — A person reported that their friend was struggling with self-harm and thoughts of suicide. School teams investigated and it was determined that the student was self-harming, but not suicidal. The student is receiving counseling services and the parents are aware.
- Correct use of Safe2Tell** — A person reported that several students at their school were making sexual comments and body shaming their peers. School teams investigated and the students involved admitted to making inappropriate comments. The students' parents were notified, school disciplinary action was taken, and a restorative conversation was facilitated.
