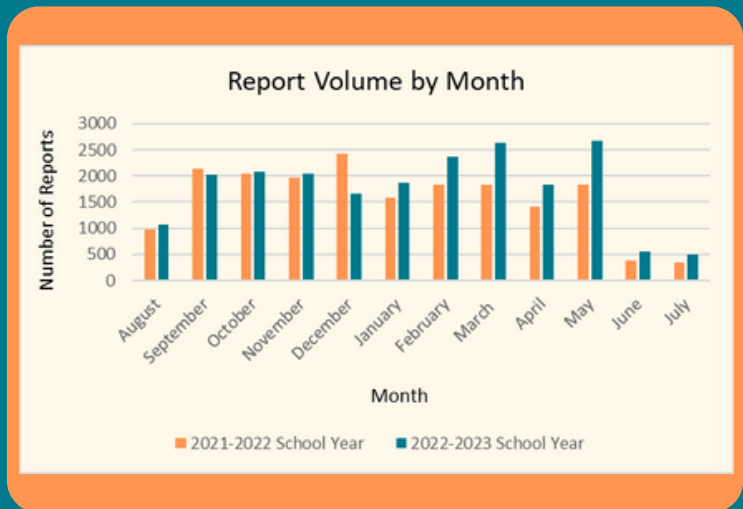

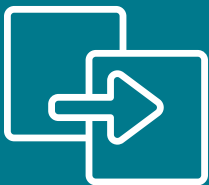

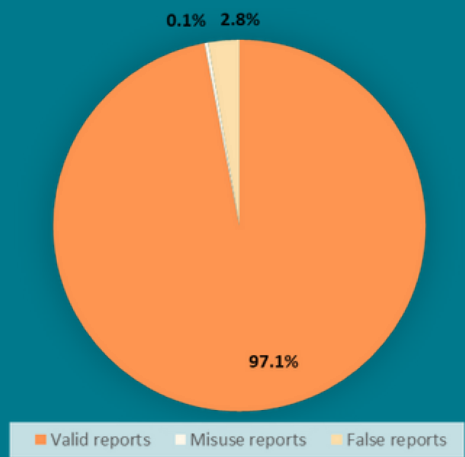
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 2,133 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 30 duplicates were reported in July alone—an 7% increase compared to June.

97.1% Valid reports



97.1% of reports received during the 2022-2023 school year, which began August 1, 2022, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

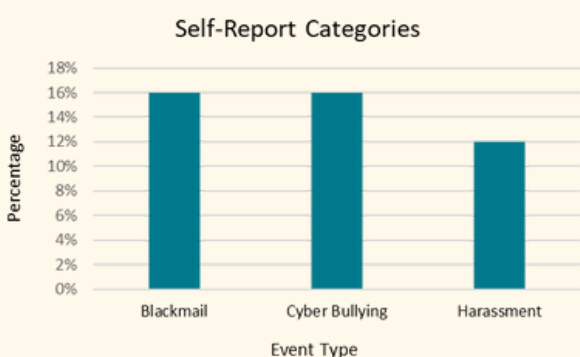
A person reported that a student and their parent were being physically abused. Local law enforcement investigated and arrested the individual harming the student and parent.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported that their peer expressed concerns about a stalker. School teams investigated and contacted the student's parent, who is working with the sheriff's office.
