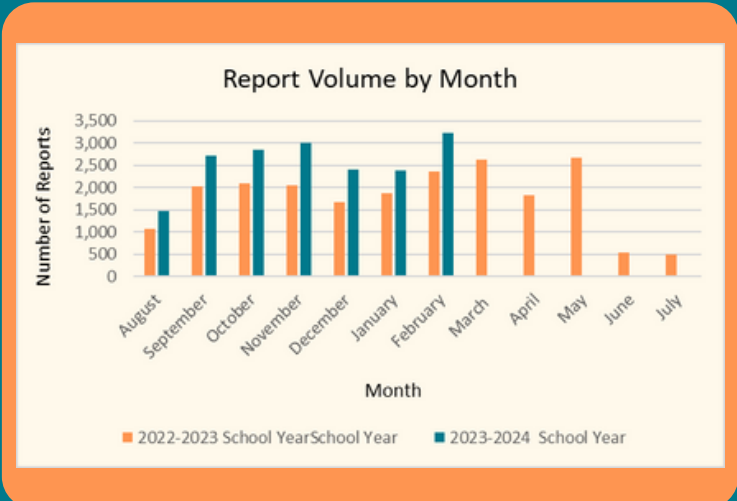

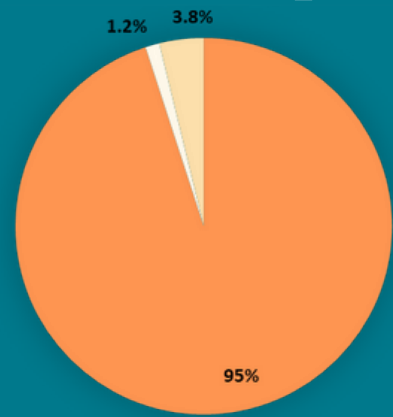
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 1,523 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 275 duplicates were reported in February alone—a 36% increase compared to January.

95% of reports received during the 2023-2024 school year, which began August 1, 2023, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

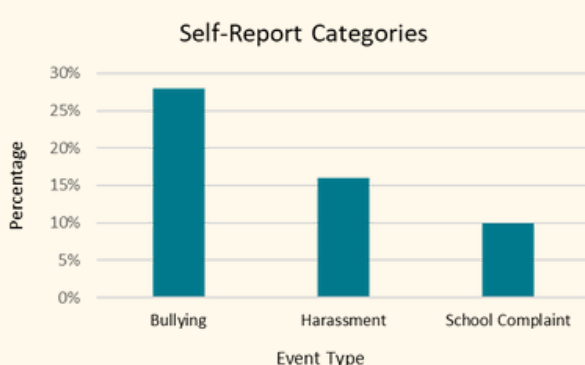
A person reported a concern about a peer having an eating disorder because they were constantly making comments about the physical appearance of other students, and they were using the school restroom for extended periods of time after lunch. Local teams spoke with the student and their parents, and the parents said they will check on the student.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported concerns about a student who had drugs on them and was feeling suicidal. Local law enforcement conducted a welfare check and spoke with the student and their parents. As a result, the student was put on a safety plan.
