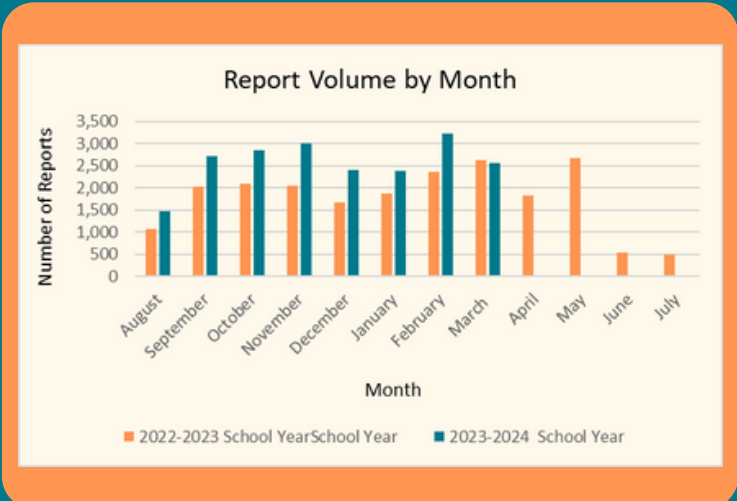

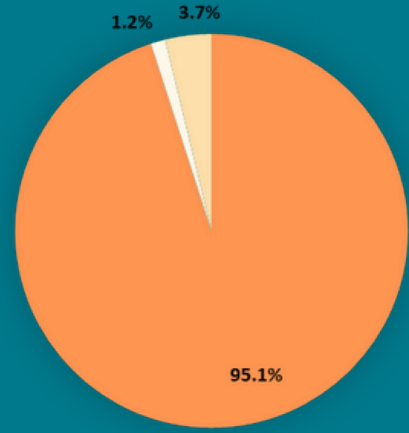
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 1,723 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 199 duplicates were reported in March alone—a 28% decrease compared to March.

95.1% Valid reports



95.1% of reports received during the 2023-2024 school year, which began August 1, 2023, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

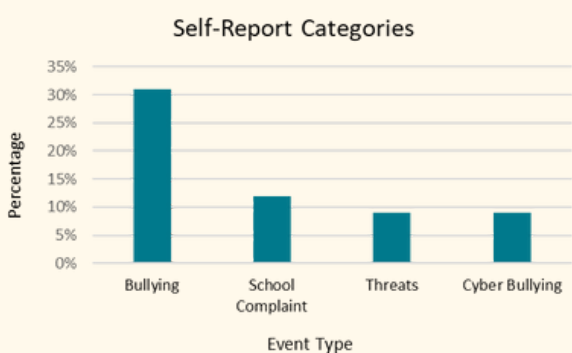
A person reported a peer being bullied and harassed by a group of students, which was affecting their school work and overall well-being. School teams spoke with the students engaged in the bullying, explaining how their actions are considered bullying behavior. School disciplinary action was taken and the students' parents were notified.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported a peer was self-harming, having suicidal ideations, and had written a note about their plans. Local teams conducted a welfare check and spoke with the student who confirmed they were having suicidal ideations. The student's parents were notified, and the student was transported to their local hospital.
