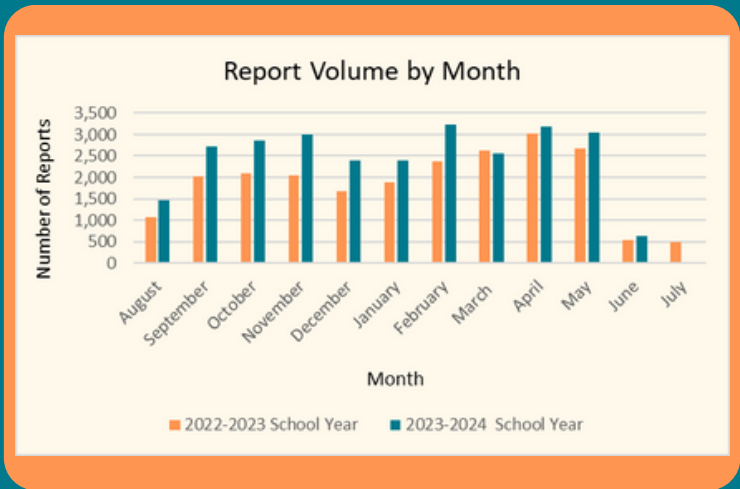

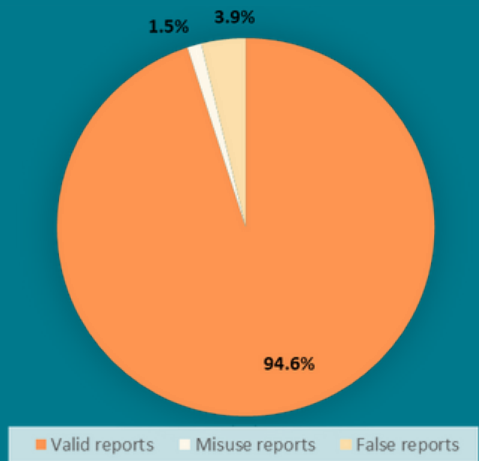
## Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 2,320 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year; 40 duplicates were reported in June alone—a 86% decrease compared to May.

## 94.6% Valid reports



94.6% of reports received during the 2023-2024 school year, which began August 1, 2023, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

## Sample reports

Correct use of Safe2Tell

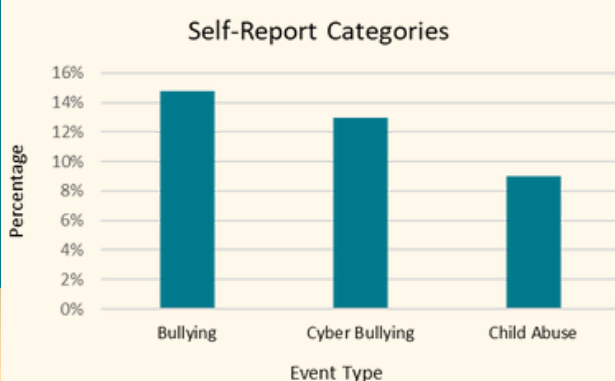
A person reported a student threatening suicide. Authorities conducted a welfare check and spoke with the student who confirmed having suicidal ideations and a plan to take their life. Authorities contacted the student's parents, transferred the student to the hospital, and the student was admitted for treatment.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported concerns about a peer who looked sick and was not eating. The SRO conducted a welfare check and spoke with the student and their parents who were aware of the eating disorder. The student is safe and is seeing a therapist.
