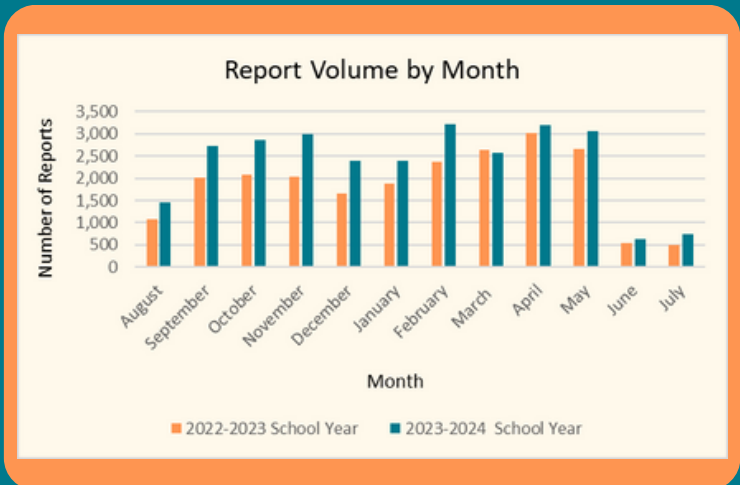

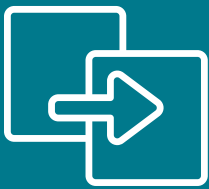

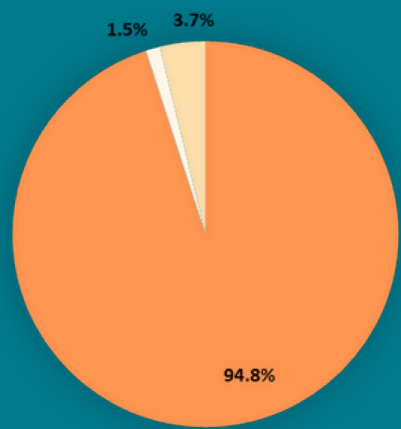
Duplicate reports



Duplicate reports are those regarding a concern or event that has already been reported, and they indicate a healthy culture of reporting safety concerns in a community. 2,450 duplicate reports were reported during the school year; 130 duplicates were reported in July alone—a 225% increase compared to June.

94.8% Valid reports



94.8% of reports received during the 2023-2024 school year, which began August 1, 2023, were determined to be valid. Valid reports are those requiring a response, and that are made with the intent to protect, prevent harm, or help.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

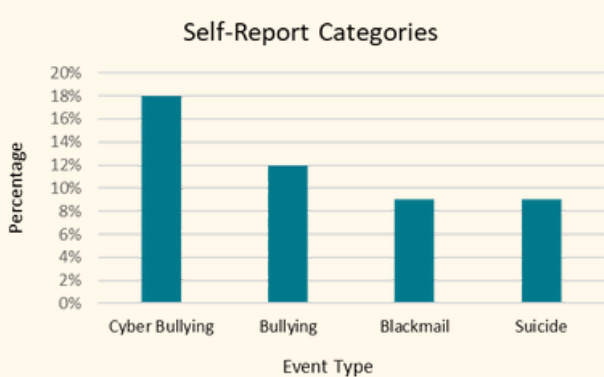
A person reported a student bullying another student about their appearance. School teams notified the parents, will conduct school disciplinary action, and will monitor the student once school is back in session.

Correct use of Safe2Tell

A person reported a student using drugs and pressuring other students to use drugs. School teams are aware and the Dean and counselor meet with the student once school is back in session.
